

MARCH 9, 2008

Toyota earns its inaugural NASCAR Sprint Cup Series victory when Kyle Busch captures the checkered flag at Atlanta Motor Speedway. Busch starts sixth and leads a race-high 173 of 325 laps en route to the checkered flag. Toyota's inaugural NSCS win came in the manufacturer's 40th race.

FEBRUARY 21, 2009

Toyota driver Kyle Busch makes NASCAR history when he becomes the first driver to win two national touring series races on the same day at one track -- California's Auto Club Speedway (Fontana, Calif.). Busch leads 95 of 100 laps en route to a victory in the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series race and later in the afternoon he leads 143 of 150 laps to win the NASCAR Nationwide Series race.

MARCH 7, 2009

Kyle Busch earns his 25th victory in a Toyota when he wins the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series race at Atlanta Motor Speedway. Busch records his 25 triumphs – which include nine NASCAR Sprint Cup Series wins, 11 NASCAR Nationwide Series victories and five NASCAR Camping World Series victories – in 94 starts in a Toyota.

MAY 2, 2009

Kyle Busch becomes just the second driver to win a NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race on his birthday. (Cale Yarborough was the first driver to accomplish that feat in 1977 and 1983.) Busch's win enables him to tie Jeff Gordon for the most Sprint Cup Series victories (15) by a driver before the age of 25.

JUNE 27, 2009

Toyota earns its 100th NASCAR win when Camry driver Kyle Busch is victorious in the NASCAR Nationwide Series race at New Hampshire Motor Speedway.

AUGUST 22, 2009

Kyle Busch becomes the driver with the most NASCAR Sprint Cup Series wins before the age of 25 with his victory at Tennessee's Bristol Motor Speedway. It gives Busch 16 NSCS triumphs -- including 12 behind the wheel of a Toyota Camry.

NOVEMBER 21, 2009

Camry driver Kyle Busch wins the NASCAR Nationwide Series driver's championship in the season-finale at Homestead-Miami Speedway. It marks the first time that a Camry racer has earned a NASCAR driver's championship. Busch also won the season-finale event at Homestead-Miami Speedway, marking the first time the series champion won the final race since 1983 (Sam Ard).

NOVEMBER 21, 2009

Toyota driver Kyle Busch breaks numerous NASCAR Nationwide Series records in 2009. Busch establishes single-season series records for laps lead (2,698 laps) and runner-up race finishes (11). He also finishes the 2009 NNS season with nine wins, 25 top-fives and 30 top-10s -- tying Jeff Green's record (2000) for the most top-five finishes in a single season.



MAY 29, 2010

Kyle Busch wins his 50th NASCAR race driving a Toyota with his NASCAR Nationwide Series victory at Charlotte Motor Speedway. Busch's 50 race wins in a Toyota have come in just 199 starts across all three of NASCAR's premier series. Busch's 50 race wins include 14 in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series, 24 in the NASCAR Nationwide Series and 12 in the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series.

JUNE 26, 2010

Kyle Busch leads 125 laps in the NASCAR Nationwide Series race at New Hampshire Motor Speedway to become the all-time Nationwide Series lap leader with 8,117 laps led. Mark Martin held the previous series record with 8,082 laps led.

AUGUST 20, 2010

Toyota earns its 50th NASCAR Nationwide Series victory when Kyle Busch captures the checkered flag at Tennessee's Bristol Motor Speedway.

AUGUST 21, 2010

Kyle Busch becomes the first driver in NASCAR history to sweep all three races in a single weekend at one track after he wins the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series, NASCAR Nationwide Series and NASCAR Camping World Truck Series races at Tennessee's Bristol Motor Speedway.

AUGUST 27, 2010

Toyota earns its 75th NASCAR Camping World Truck Series victory when Kyle Busch captures the checkered flag at Chicagoland Speedway.

SEPTEMBER 25, 2010

Camry driver Kyle Busch sets a new NASCAR Nationwide Series record with 11 race wins in a single season when he captured the checkered flag in the Nationwide Series event at Delaware's Dover International Speedway. The triumph at Dover was Busch's 30th trip to victory lane in a Toyota in the Nationwide Series.

NOVEMBER 19, 2010


Toyota driver Kyle Busch wins the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series race at Homestead-Miami Speedway to record the 15th Tundra win in 2010 -- the most victories in a single season since the manufacturer joined the series in 2004. Busch's win also enables Kyle Busch Motorsports (KBM) to earn the Camping World Truck Series owner's championship in its inaugural season in the series.

NOVEMBER 20, 2010

Toyota driver Kyle Busch wins the NASCAR Nationwide Series race at Homestead-Miami Speedway -- his record-setting 13th victory during the 2010 season. The previous record was held by Sam Ard (1983) and Busch (2009), who each won 10 NNS races in a single season. Busch's win enables Joe Gibbs Racing to earn its third straight series owner's title with the No. 18 Camry, after previously winning with the No. 20 Camry (2008) and the No. 18 Camry (2009).

JULY 16, 2011

Toyota Camry driver Kyle Busch earns his 100th victory across NASCAR's three national touring series when he records a victory in the Nationwide Series race at New Hampshire Motor Speedway. Busch's 100 wins include 22 in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series, 49 in the NASCAR Nationwide Series and 29 in the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series.

AUGUST 21, 2011

Kyle Busch makes his 300th NASCAR start driving a Toyota. Since his first race driving a Toyota in February 2008, Busch has made 131 NASCAR Sprint Cup Series starts, 110 NASCAR Nationwide Series starts and 59 NASCAR Camping World Truck Series starts. In his 300 starts in a Toyota, Busch has recorded 19 Sprint Cup Series wins, 38 Nationwide Series victories and 23 Camping World Truck Series wins.

AUGUST 21, 2011

When Toyota Camry driver Kyle Busch claims the first-place trophy in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race at Michigan International Speedway it marks the 100th win for the Camry in NASCAR competition. Since the Camry made its debut in the Sprint Cup Series and NASCAR Nationwide Series in 2007, Camry drivers have won 38 Sprint Cup Series races and 62 Nationwide Series events.

AUGUST 26, 2011

Toyota Camry driver Kyle Busch sets a new NASCAR Nationwide Series record for the most all-time series wins when he captures the checkered flag at Tennessee's Bristol Motor Speedway and earns his 50th career Nationwide Series victory.

Mark Martin previously held the record at 49 NNS wins.

FEBRUARY 18, 2012

Kyle Busch wins the Shootout – a non-points, special event to 'kick-off' the season at Daytona International Speedway.

MARCH 2, 2013

Toyota driver Kyle Busch takes the checkered flag at Phoenix International Raceway in the NASCAR Nationwide Series -- the 75th victory for the Camry in the series.

MARCH 24, 2013

Toyota driver Kyle Busch takes the checkered flag at California's Auto Club Speedway in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race to earn the first Sprint Cup win at Toyota's 'home' track and first win at the speedway for Joe Gibbs Racing. Busch sweeps the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series (March 24) and NASCAR Nationwide Series (March 23) races at the track.

JULY 27, 2013

Toyota driver Kyle Busch breaks Sam Ard's record (four in 1983) of wins from the pole when he takes the checkered flag in the NASCAR Nationwide Series race at Indianapolis Motor Speedway.

SEPTEMBER 1, 2013

Toyota earns its 250th NASCAR victory when Camry driver Kyle Busch crosses the finish line first in the NASCAR Sprint Cup Series race at Atlanta Motor Speedway. En route to collecting 250 NASCAR wins, Toyota drivers have accumulated 60 Sprint Cup Series wins, 84

Toyota earns its 250th NASCAR victory and 100th by Busch in a Toyota (Atlanta, 2013)

Nationwide Series triumphs, and 106 NASCAR Camping World Truck Series first-place trophies.

SEPTEMBER 1, 2013

Camry driver Kyle Busch earns his 100th victory in a Toyota across NASCAR's three national touring series. En route to collecting 100 wins with Toyota, Busch has totaled 24 Camry wins in the Sprint Cup Series and 49 in the Nationwide Series, and 27 Tundra victories in the NASCAR Camping World Truck Series.

JUNE 26, 2014

Toyota driver Kyle Busch wins all five NASCAR Camping World Truck Series races he's entered so far this season. In addition to winning the 2013 series finale, the six consecutive wins (Homestead-Miami, Daytona, Kansas, Charlotte, Dover and Kentucky) marks the longest Truck Series victory streak by Busch, all earned by his Kyle Busch Motorsports team.
